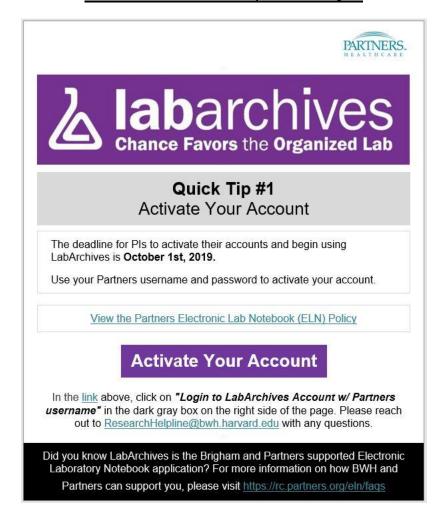

Quick Tip #5

Using your partners.org vs. bwh.harvard.edu email address to activate your account

After the switch from *partners.org* email addresses to *bwh.harvard.edu* email addresses, *bwh.harvard.edu* became the 'primary email account' for many users.

Why does this matter?

You should use your 'primary email account' when activating your LabArchives account to optimize the platform's functionality. For example, a mismatch will disrupt your ability to use the inbox feature.

To check which address is your 'primary email account':

- 1. Compose a new email in Outlook
- 2. Look in the 'From' field at the top
- Confirm whether this is your bwh.harvard.edu or partners.org address

Once you've confirmed your 'primary email account', use that email address to activate your Partners LabArchives account.

Already activated your LabArchives account using the wrong email address? Contact edcsupport@partners.org.

Not sure which address you used to activate your LabArchives account?

- Go to <u>mynotebook.labarchives.com</u>
- You will likely see the email you used to activate your account on the sign-in page
 - If you're automatically signed in through Single-Sign On (SSO), you can check which email was used: 1. Click on your name in the top right corner, 2. Click "User Properties", 3. Check your email address.

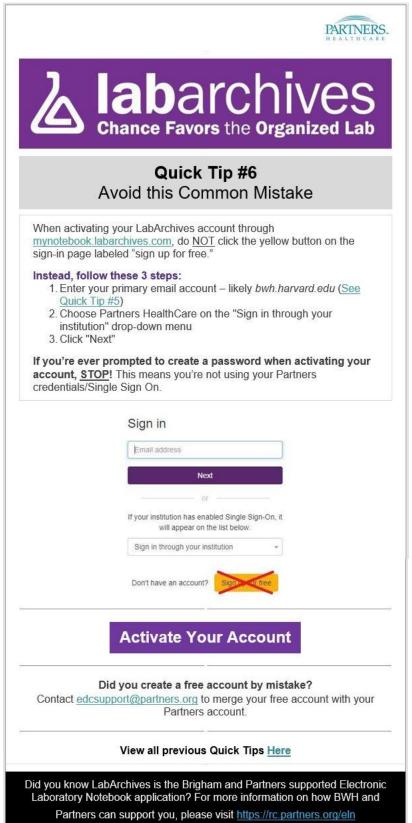

Are you a Principal Investigator (PI) at BWH?
You must activate your LabArchives account by 10/1/19

Steps to Activate your Account: This takes less than 30 seconds!

- 1. Visit mynotebook.labarchives.com
 - Do NOT use Internet Explorer. Use Google Chrome, Safari, or Firefox
 - · Do NOT click the yellow button "Sign up for free"
- 2. Select "Partners HealthCare" as your institution
 - You will be redirected to the Partners Single Sign-On page. Enter your Partners credentials if prompted.
- 3. Click the button "I do not have a LabArchives account..."
 - If you previously created a free account where you established a
 unique username and password, click "I have an existing
 LabArchives account already" instead. Input the email and
 password you previously used to create your LabArchives account
 and skip step #4.
- 4. Enter your 'primary email account,' likely your bwh.harvard.edu account. To find out:
 - · Compose a new email in Outlook
 - . Look in the 'From' field at the top
 - Confirm whether this is your bwh.harvard.edu or partners.org email address
- 5. Click "Create New Account." When asked "Do you want to link this existing LabArchives account with your login credentials?" click "Yes"
- 6. Enter your first and last name, confirm that your email is your 'primary email account' (see step #4), leave "ORCID" blank, and click "Update"

Important Notes:

- If you're ever prompted to create a password for LabArchives, STOP! Your account must be linked to Partners allowing you to log in using your Partners login credentials. Register through Partners using the steps above.
- If a member of your research staff shares their notebook with you, prompting you to create a LabArchives account, STOPI First, follow the steps above to activate your LabArchives account through Partners
- The PI should be the owner of every notebook. Research staff should transfer ownership to their PI for any notebooks they created.

Quick Tip #8

Make sure you own a notebook for your research group!

Pls: Now that you've <u>activated your LabArchives</u> account, make sure you own a notebook!

When you first activate/open your account, you may or may not see a notebook named "Partners HealthCare" with the entry heading "Partners HealthCare Research Community Notebook." This is a notebook accessible by the entire Partners research community. (If you don't see this notebook, please contact edc.support@partners.org)

Regardless of whether you see this enterprise notebook, you (the PI) should own AT LEAST one notebook for your research group.

- Click "Notebooks" in the top left corner of the screen. This shows you all notebooks to which you have access. AT LEAST one of these should be owned by you (the PI). To add a notebook, click the "+" sign in the top left corner and complete the information requested.
- If a member of your research staff shared their notebook with you, make sure that staff member transfers the notebook ownership to you (the PI). Also be sure they share their notebook with your correct email address – the one you used to activate your account!

Quick Tip #9

I do clinical research. Do I have to use LabArchives? YES.

Clinical research is within the scope for the LabArchives

requirement. It is a place for you to document and organize your overall study plan. The primary data does not have to be stored in LabArchives; however, clinical researchers should document where all critical data exists

Think of LabArchives as a platform for creating a central storyboard for everything related to your study; someone 10 years from now should be able to retrieve all relevant information to understand your project from your LabArchives notebook.

Examples of what to include in LabArchives:

- · Links to IRB documents and protocol numbers in Insight
- · Links to study data in REDCap or other data storage locations
- · Sponsor/DMSB/etc. correspondence
- · Statistical analysis plans and links to statistical files
